Analysis updated for Bill version Engrossed on Feb 09, 2023 on 03/24/2023 at 3:56 PM

Establishes the Credit allowed against individual and corporate income tax liability, for taxable years beginning January 1, 2024, for increased hourly labor costs that result from paying a local minimum wage that is more than the state minimum wage. Sets the amount of the Credit at 10 percent of the difference between the actual hourly labor costs the employer paid during the taxable year and the total amount of hours worked by employees during the taxable year multiplied by the state minimum wage. Requires the State Treasurer, on notice from the Arizona Department of Revenue (ADOR), to withhold from a city's or town's URS Fund distribution an amount equal to one-twelfth of the total Credit amount claimed by taxpayers in that city or town for the prior taxable year. Requires the State Treasurer to deposit the withheld URS Fund monies in the state General Fund. Prohibits the State Treasurer from withholding any amount that a city or town certifies as being necessary to make any required deposits or payments for debt service on bonds or other long-term obligations that were issued or incurred by a pledge of URS fund monies. Allows the Credit to be carried forward for five consecutive years, if the Credit exceeds the claimant's liability.

This bill will result in a decrease in state shared revenue. But no amount being necessary for required deposits or payments of debt service on bonds or long-term obligations that were issued or incurred by a pledge of URS monies can be withheld if City certifies the money as being necessary for debt service on bonds or other long-term obligations that were issued or incurred by a pledge of URS monies.

This bill provides employers with a non-refundable tax credit to account for the employers' increased compensation costs to pay a minimum hourly wage rate mandated by a city or town in Arizona that is higher than the minimum wage rate of the state of Arizona. The credit will be equal to 10% of the wage rate differential on compensation paid to employees. Increased tax credits have a negative fiscal impact on the City's budget from state-shared revenue.

Income Tax, Credit, Labor Cost

ARS 43-206, proposed subsection G states, pursuant to ARS 43-1079 (credit of up to a \$1,000 per qualified employee), the State Treasurer shall withhold from a city or town from the State's distribution for every qualified employee and amount equal to one-twelfth of the total amount of tax credit claimed under section ARS 43-1079. The credit is allowed against the corporate/income taxes imposed under Title 43, for a portion of a taxpayer's increased hourly labor cost that results from paying a local minimum wage that is more than the State's minimum wage. The amount of credit is ten percent (10%), of the difference between the amount of hourly labor cost paid to employee vs the State's minimum wage.

This is only an example of proposed language:

	One Employee
State Treasurer to withhold from City distribution 12%	\$ 13.85
State minimum wage per hour January 1, 2023	\$ 20.00
Employer paid employee an hour on January 1, 2023	\$ 6.15
Difference	\$ 0.62
Amount of propose credit, 10% of difference	\$ 0.54
State portion 80%	\$ 0.07
Employee's address in Phoenix 12% - Phoenix portion of the credit:	\$ 0.07

This is a direct impact to the city. Since the portion attributable to the City will be automatically deducted from the State shared revenue, the city does not have control or wouldn't be able to verify/audit numbers provided by the State. This bill creates two issues for the city. 1) The portion of the City credit to be withheld by the State can be a large amount, city general fund will be impacted., 2) Credit is against State tax income tax collection. Smaller income tax amount to be used for sharing with the cities. If enacted the law takes effect After December 31, 2023. City should oppose this bill.

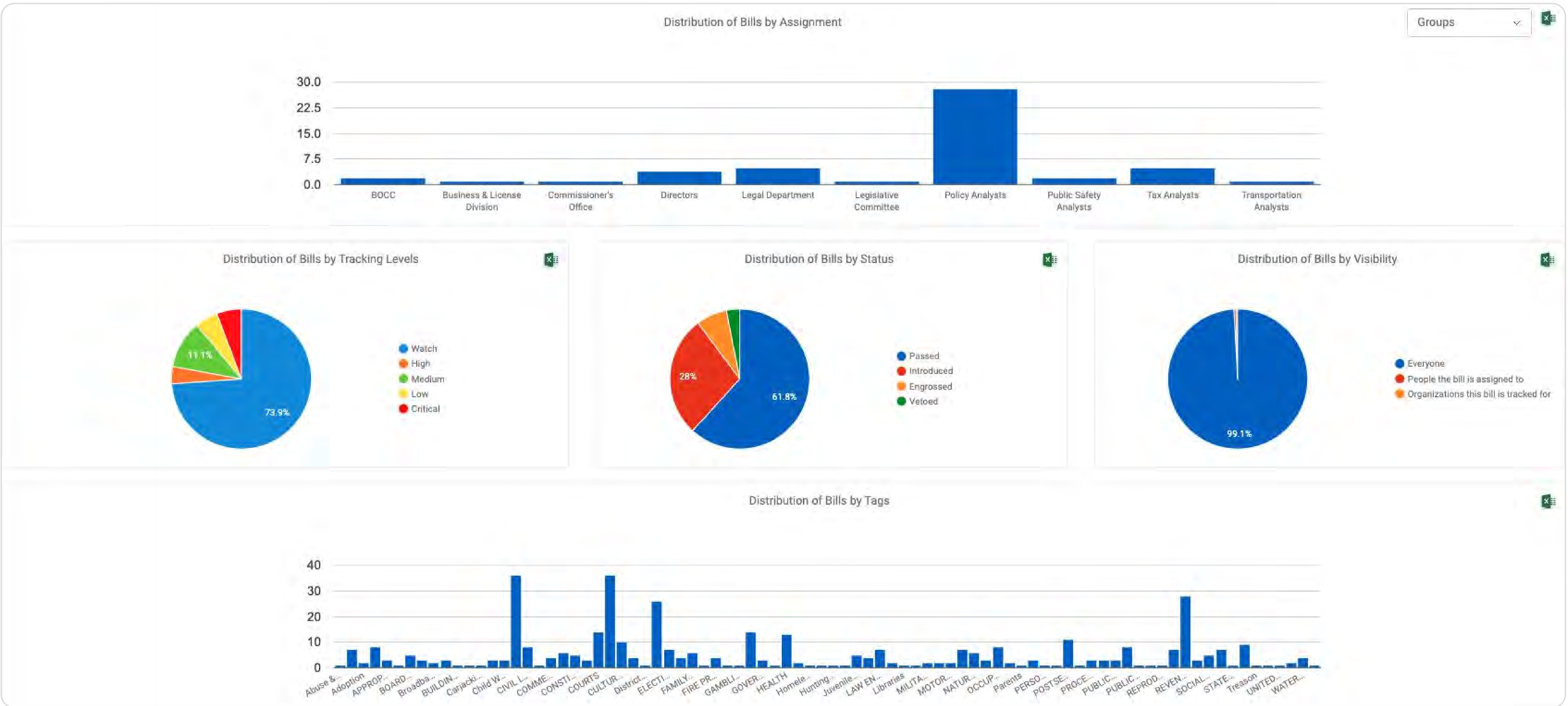

It codifies the current policy for pre-medical claims that was repeated last session in HB735. It also gave a path forward for different requests for approved indigent claims. Currently, the Catastrophic Health Care Fund receives \$5.00 of every state dollar fee. Since the CAT Fund and budget will be repealed this legislation sends the \$5.00 through the existing formula to distribute it to the county district of the state general fund. The highway distribution account, the state public child income fund, and the HB735 funds this legislation repeals the CAT fund account but extends the Catastrophic Health Care Fund until the end of September 2023 to allow for the completion of the audit and annual reports.
